The Omaha Police Department wants to encourage everyone to be mindful of their surroundings and if they see anyone suspicious to call 911 immediately. Crimes can occur anytime of the day or night. Please review some of the safety tips below. Together we can create safer environments for all.

- Please contact 911 if you see any suspicious behavior in your neighborhood. Do not be afraid to call the police
- Make sure doors, windows, locks and screens are all in good condition and locked
- Replace any exterior light bulbs that have burned out and keep exterior lights on at night
- Never unlock your door until you know who the visitor is
- If you have a security system make sure it is on and working
- Check to make sure any electronic surveillance equipment is working
- If someone comes to your door claiming to need help, keep your door locked and call 911 for them
- Never allow a stranger entry to your home
- Keep your keys ready when you are approaching your door at home and your vehicle
- Park in well lit areas and watch for suspicious people lurking near your vehicle
- Cold weather is coming. Never leave the keys in an unattended car
- Keep your registration and automatic garage door openers in a locked glove compartment
- Be aware of your surroundings at all time
