MORE NEWS

Dear BRNA Neighbors,

Your Nebraska Legislature ended its 2011 session on May 26th. Over the next few months, I would like to take this opportunity to share a few of the session's achievements with you:



LB 386, LB 387 & LB 389: Creating Jobs and Opportunities in Omaha

Nebraska is still seeing effects of our national economic challenge with our local entrepreneurs continuing to look outside the state for opportunities. LB 386, LB 387, and LB 389, which I was proud to co-sponsor, all take steps to help us solve this problem.

LB 386 provides matching funds to employers to offer Nebraska college students (both 2 year and 4 year) paid internships, which increases the likelihood these students will remain in Nebraska after graduation. In looking out for our community, I helped lead the fight to ensure this program provides extra incentives towards those businesses located in South Omaha.

LB 387 creates the Nebraska Business Innovation Act, which targets resources to help turn Nebraska research, technology, and innovation into new Nebraska businesses and jobs. I also worked with local organizations to ensure that South Omaha's entrepreneurship programs are eligible for this critical microenterprise funding.

Lastly, LB 389 creates a tax credit program for investors who assist entrepreneurs and small businesses gain the much-needed capital to start-up and launch a new business.

MORE NEWS

Senator Johanns e-Update

June 22, 2011

I participated in two meetings today with people who play important roles in the flood response in our state, the first of which was with Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Administrator Craig Fugate. Many of you have raised concerns about the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP), which is administered by FEMA, and during the meeting I asked Administrator Fugate in person and in writing to explain FEMA's rationale and how they will address these issues. We must do everything possible to make sure those who have suffered are treated fairly, and I look forward to his response.

Today I also met with Brigadier General John McMahon, Division Commander of the Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) to ask him about the series of decisions that led to the historic releases and corresponding flooding within the Missouri River basin. I am also looking into the Corps' operational manual to determine whether it constrained the Corps' ability to prepare for the flooding.

I understand that this is a busy time for both FEMA and USACE, and I appreciate both gentlemen taking time out to hear firsthand about concerns in Nebraska. As I've said before, their focus right now must be on managing the floodwaters and responding to the disaster, but the time will come for answers to valid, important questions. I will continue to stay heavily involved in the flooding situation and keep you updated on my efforts, as well as responses to the important questions being raised.

Anyone experiencing personal and business losses due to flooding is strongly encouraged to report their damage to the Nebraska Emergency Management Agency (NEMA) or at (855) 211-2453 so the agency can determine whether the state meets federal thresholds for individual assistance.

GRAIN ELEVATORS

Mayor, Councilman and other Elected Officials,

In November 5, 2003 I wrote you a letter about Grain Elevators in Omaha and Nebraska. It was about the one on 34th and Vinton.

Today another young man fell from the one off Dahlman Ave. – North of 29th & L Street. He apparently was tagging graffiti. I believe he is still alive. Back then my letter was about one grain elevator, Now today, there must be something more to reinforce the safety of these grain elevators.

In November of 2003 Omaha World Herald did a story about a 13 year old girl who fell 100 feet to her death. Her name was Vanessa Cabillas.

These accidents and deaths are preventative, but the City of Omaha and Nebraska must finally strengthen the codes and Laws on these elevators. I don't care who buys them for pennies, in how they switch their titles to be relieved of their responsibility. These owners need to make these grain elevators safe. Knock them down or do something positive with them for the community!

We are tired of looking at those useless pieces concrete that cloud our skies. We are still happy about what the 34th & Vinton did with their murals, but it is merely a cover up to a bigger problem. Not only are they an eye sore, they are dangerous if left unattended and accessible to children as a playground. Children will be children and some adults never outlive their childhood. But city codes should be strong enough on these Grain Elevators to protect children's curiosity!

I asked back then in 2003 for stronger codes on these elevators, now I am asking again. If residents must comply with codes on their home, for upkeep, again why do these Grain Elevators continue to get away with unsafe hazards?

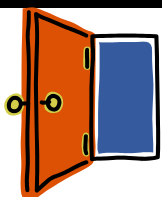

STUCK LIGHTBULBS

- 1) Make sure that you've turned the power off to your light fixture. If it's a lamp, unplug it. If it's an overhead light, turn off the circuit breaker.
- 2) If you have some sort of work gloves, put them on. If you don't, be very careful. If you're working above your head, put on glasses of some type. You don't want glass shards falling in your eyes.
- 3) Using your needle-nosed pliers, grab the edge of the metal base of the light bulb and bend it slightly inward.
- 4) Turn the base in the same direction you'd turn to remove an intact bulb. **Psst, that's counter-clockwise.**
- 5) Once you're done, vacuum up the area glass to completely get rid of any glass shards.

To Prevent Bulb from Sticking

Clean the threads of the light bulb with a clean rag. Take a small amount of dielectric grease on your fingers and rub it on the threads of the light bulb. You do not want the grease to be too thick, but you need to put enough on to coat the threads. Dielectric or bulb grease is available at any hardware, electronic or automotive store. (Vaseline works in a pinch ó just ölightlyö!)

BBQ Pork for Sandwiches (Slow Cooker)

"Mouth-watering pork cooked in a slow cooker with beef broth served with barbecue sauce."

INGREDIENTS:

- 1 (14 ounce) can beef broth
- 3 pounds boneless pork ribs
- 1 (18 ounce) bottle barbeque sauce

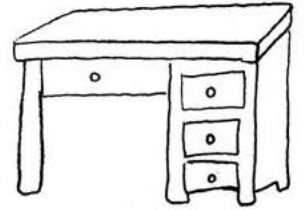
DIRECTIONS:

1. Pour can of beef broth into slow cooker, and add boneless pork ribs. Cook on High heat for 4 hours, or until meat shreds easily. Remove meat, and shred with two forks. It will seem that it's not working right away, but it will.
2. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C). Transfer the shredded pork to a Dutch oven or iron skillet, and stir in barbeque sauce.
3. Bake in the preheated oven for 30 minutes, or until heated through.
4. Serve on hamburger buns.

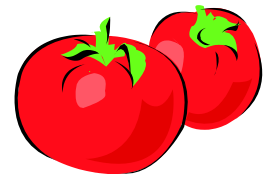

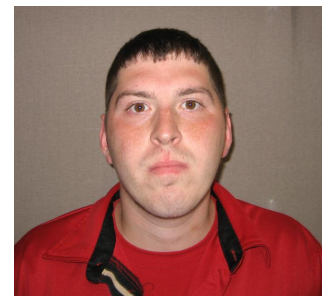
